Annual Committee Update

2021 has been a challenging year for the Road Committee having to balance limited resources, unprecedented price increases in gravel and labor, and difficulty finding qualified contractors available to complete work on Goose Creek Lane. January to March 2021 was a winter with more snow than this area has seen in several years with a wide swing in temperatures. The Road Committee has spent a lot of time and effort coordinating road maintenance support to ensure that the road has been cleared of snow and maintained. Despite the committee's efforts, unfortunately, the road became very muddy in places. Our former resident, BJ Brixius (Owner of Village Landscapes and Irrigation) was able to help us solve this problem. He had gravel trucks and crews up here for almost 2 weeks working to repair the road.

For 2022 the road committee would like to undertake repairs to the Hill, ensuring proper ditches are put in place and the road is properly graded to allow for drainage of water. Once this capital improvement project is completed, additional projects to other parts of the road may be undertaken, if the 2022 budget from dues received are sufficient for the work.

The Road Committee has used much of last year identifying and meeting with six road contractors to provide estimates for capital improvements to the road in 2022. The result of our inquiries was as follows:

- Two never showed up (despite multiple appointment attempts)
- Two were way out of the reasonable budget range (\$20,000 or more estimated costs for the hill alone)
- One did not have the experience or the heavy equipment needed to work on the hill

The final contractor has the experience, equipment, and is reasonable in cost (more will be explained about this estimate in the capital improvement section).

Seeking a Treasurer

Scott Butler is retiring from the Road Committee after 2 years of service in February 2022. The road committee is seeking a Goose Creek Farms resident to serve as Treasurer. Duties include:

- Writing Checks to pay vendors and bills
- Maintaining road committee business
 checking account
- Depositing road dues payments upon receipt
- Maintaining balance sheet and track of dues and expenses

2022 GCL Capital Improvement Plan

The main hill on Goose Creek Lane is overdue for significant road repairs due to weather and general wear. While the road committee spends the majority of its road repair expense maintaining the hill, our routine repairs are gradually becoming insufficient. The committee believes it has become necessary for a significant capital improvement to that section of Goose Creek Lane. Of the contractors that we solicited estimates from in 2021, only one qualified vendor was identified and was willing to perform the work at a reasonable price: \$13000. While this total may seem steep, after evaluating all offers and performing due diligence, the committee is confident that this offer is fair and reasonable for the work to be performed.

Capital Improvement Scope of Work

From Lime Kiln to Fox Hollow, Goose Creek Lane will be cut and cleared. The ditches will be cleaned out. 100 tons of 21A gravel will be spread. The right of way will be power raked, graded, and vibratory rolled.

Subject to completion of this first phase, and with sufficient budget, the committee will contract with the same vendor to return one or two times a year for \$3000 (plus the cost of any needed gravel) to do maintenance of the entire length of road from Lime Kiln to Wild Goose Lane, thus guaranteeing that the road is kept in good condition year-round.

Request of Goose Creek Farms Neighbors

Dues will not be increased above the 2021 request of \$500 per household. However, we are asking for an additional one-time donation of any amount (\$50? \$100? \$200? \$250?) from any of our neighbors that may be generous enough to donate a little more in support of this capital improvement project. This donation can be added to your 2022 dues or sent as an additional amount. For 2022 it is our hope to raise \$7000 between annual dues and additional donations by March so we can complete the above-detailed capital improvement without digging into Road Committee reserves.

With sufficient dues received and budget to perform the capital improvement, it is the committee's plan to initiate this project in March 2022. The road committee hopes that between the capital improvement project and regular maintenance we will decrease overall annual maintenance expenses and keep the road in better overall condition.
